What personal information we collect

The personal information we collect from you will vary depending on which services you engage us to deliver. The personal information we collect might include your name, address, telephone number, email address, your Unique Tax Reference (UTR) number, your National Insurance number, bank account details, your IP address, which pages you may have visited on our website and when you accessed them.

Where we collect personal information from

We may collect personal data information about you (or your business) from these sources:

- Government and law enforcement agencies.

- Public information sources such as Companies House
- Agents working on your behalf

How we use your information to make automated decisions

We sometimes use systems to make automated decisions based on personal information we have – or are allowed to collect from others – about you or your business. This helps us to make sure our decisions are quick, fair, efficient and correct, based on what we know

Here are the types of automated decision we make:

- Correcting PAYE coding notices
- Obtaining rental statements
- Obtaining pensions and financial investments for completion of tax returns
- Reducing tax payments on account
- National insurance deferment or overpayment
- Money laundering checks

If you do not provide your personal information

Personal information may be needed to be collected by statute, or under the terms of contract we have in place with you. By not providing us with this personal information could prevent or postpone us from meeting our professional obligations. As a result, this could also mean that we cannot perform your requested services.

How long we retain your personal information for

Personal data processed for any purpose or purposes shall not be kept for longer than is necessary unless instructed to by yourself or we feel required for professional indemnity purposes.

In the event you are no longer a client, please explicitly contact us regarding any social media and website contact that you would no longer wish to be part of.

Holding personal information outside the EEA

Data would only be sent outside of the European Economic Area (EEA) to either comply with specific legal duties or following your instructions.

Any information transferred outside of the EEA would be protected in the same way as it were being used in the EEA.



Using our website

Your rights

Access to your information – You have the right to request a copy of the personal information about you that we hold.

Correcting your information – We want to make sure that your personal information is accurate, complete and up to date and you may ask us to correct any personal information about you that you believe does not meet these standards.

Deletion of your information – You have the right to ask us to delete personal information about you where:

- You consider that we no longer require the information for the purposes for which it was obtained.
- We are using that information with your consent and you have withdrawn your consent – see *Withdrawing consent to using your information* below.
- You have validly objected to our use of your personal information – see *Objecting to how we may use your information* below.
- Our use of your personal information is contrary to law or our other legal obligations.

Objecting to how we may use your information – You have the right at any time to require us to stop using your personal information for direct marketing purposes. In addition, where we use your personal information to perform tasks carried out in the public interest then, if you ask us to, we will stop using that personal information unless there are overriding legitimate grounds to continue.

Restricting how we may use your information – In some cases, you may ask us to restrict how we use your personal information. This right might apply, for example, where we are checking the accuracy of personal information about you that we hold or assessing the validity of any objection you have made to our use of your information. The right might also apply where this is no longer a basis for using your personal information but you don't want us to delete the data. Where this right is validly exercised, we may only use the relevant personal information with your consent, for legal claims or where there are other public interest grounds to do so.

Automated processing – If we use your personal information on an automated basis to make decisions which significantly affect you, you have the right to ask that the decision be reviewed by an individual to whom you may make representations and contest the decision. This right only applies where we use your information with your consent or as part of a contractual relationship with you.

Withdrawing consent using your information – Where we use your personal information with your consent you may withdraw that consent at any time and we will stop using your personal information for the purpose(s) for which consent was given.
